### **Forestry Quick Facts**

### 93% of Alabama forests

are owned by private landowners

### 75 million tons

of timber are grown annually in Alabama's forests

### 41 million tons

of the timber grown is harvested annually

### 83% more tons

are grown each year than are harvested

### 5th in the nation

in biodiversity (#1 east of the Mississippi River)

### 1st in the nation

in navigable stream miles

### 15% of US surface water

in the lower 48 states passes through Alabama

### 553 trillion gallons

of fresh water are found in 19 major aquifers in Alabama

### 41% of all CO2

emissions produced in the entire state are removed by our forests (vs 14% in US)

### 47 years

of all CO2 emissions produced in the state are currently stored in our forests
